Bronze Arts Award develops your artistic ability alongside your research and communication skills. This level involves you in the arts as a creator and audience member and encourages you to take your first steps towards leadership by sharing your learning with others.

Silver Arts Award

Silver Arts Award gives you the chance to take on an artistic challenge and a leadership role too. As well as being about creativity, it's about becoming a reviewer, researcher and project manager. You build a broad range of transferable skills as you complete your portfolio and gain a Level 2 qualification.

Throughout the delivery of the project you monitor and show your leadership skills in being creative and supportive.	You show you are working effectively with others involved in the project. You collect feedback. You record how you are developing your leadership skills.	You carry out a final review of the project considering and reviewing the leadership skills you wanted to develop and what you have learnt.
