West Blean & Thornden Woods Nature Reserve

These ancient semi-natural woodlands are a remnant of wild Britain and would once have been full of towering oaks, mossy glades and roaming wild boar. Over the centuries, the woods have been managed and changed by man.

Now designated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest, these woods are owned and managed by Kent Wildlife Trust as an important haven for wildlife.

Ancient Woodland Restoration

Kent Wildlife Trust is restoring these woods by creating a mosaic of habitats, including oak hedges, healthy glades and all important woodland for wild animals and plants to thrive. This includes the use of traditional woodland management, such as coppicing, is essential to the survival of many woodland species. The coppicing and thinning of younger plantations is allowing the recovery of native ancient woodland through natural regeneration.

Grazing Livestock

Keep on eye on the livestock grazing and browsing within the forest areas.

Highland cattle
This cattle breed is well adapted to thrive in rugged conditions.

Kent ponies
A descendant of the Exmoor and now this breed is particularly suited to wet areas.

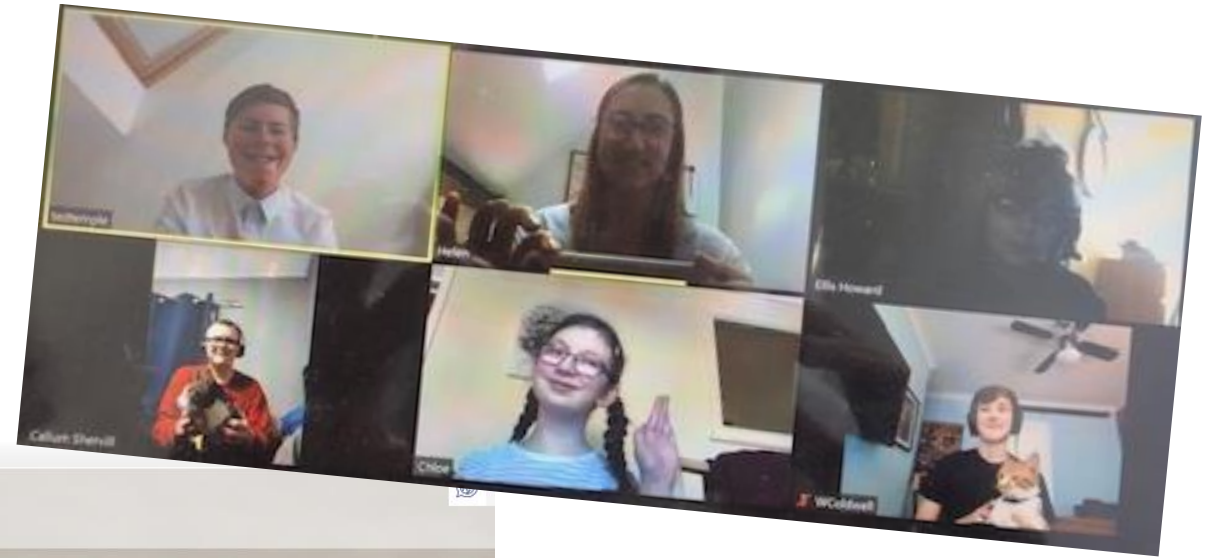
